

Notice of Regatta - Skinner Lake Recreational Outing
Skinner Lake, Temecula, California
June 22nd and 23rd, 2002

The Regatta

Sponsor: This regatta is co-sponsored by the W. D. Schock Corp. and Lido 14-San Diego; Roger Patterson serves as the Regatta Chair.

Rules: The racing will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing [RRS], the prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association and by the By Laws of the Lido 14 Class Association except as these are changed by this Notice of Regatta or by the sailing instructions. The regatta is designated Category A in accordance with Appendix G of the RRS.

Eligibility: This regatta is open to all members of the Lido 14 Class Association. Memberships in the association may be purchased by persons otherwise eligible at the regatta. In light of the proximity to the fiscal year end of the association, an applicant will be regarded as a member of the Lido 14 Class Association if dues have been paid for either the 2002-2003 year, or for the 2002-2003 year. Membership in a yacht club or sailing association is not required for either skipper or crew. The sponsoring authority reserves the right to refuse or revoke and refund registration to any person who cannot demonstrate a reasonable familiarity with the RRS. It is the responsibility of each participant to determine whether or not his or her skill level, experience, and maturity is sufficient for participation in any race or other activity of the Regatta.

Check-In and Late Registrations: Check-in and late registrations will be accepted on Friday, June 21, 2002 between 3:30 and 5:00 p.m. and Saturday, June 22, 2002 between 9:00 and 10:15 a.m. and at such other times as the organizing authority may elect.

Sailing Instructions: Sailing Instructions will be distributed at regatta check-in. The courses to be sailed will be shown on the racing instructions and in general will be of a configuration commonly referred to as triangle courses.

Schedule of Races: Seven races are scheduled with four to be sailed Saturday, June 22, 2002 and three races to be sailed on Sunday, June 23, 2002. There will be no throw out. If one or more races are finished, the regatta will be regarded as complete for registration fee and for trophy purposes. No trophy will be awarded to any entrant who does not score as a finished in at least all but one of the races for which finishes have been determined. The warning for the first race on Saturday June 22, 2002 is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. The warning for the first race on Sunday June 23, 2002 is scheduled for 11:00 a.m.

Scoring: The Low Point scoring system, rule A2 will apply.

Trophies: Trophies will be awarded skipper and crew of the top 3 finishers of the A and of the B class entrants. Entrants for both the A and B classes will be accepted and will start as the sponsor may determine appropriate in light of the sailing conditions and the number of entrants.

Race Committee: An all star race committee will be provided from the members and friends of the Class Association. MBYC Staff Commodore Ray Wegrzyn has agreed to act as Principal Race Officer.

Protest Committee: This regatta is presented for recreational purposes and participants are encouraged to use the 720-degree penalty alternative should a rule infringement occur.

SUBJECT TO THE SCANT RESTRICTIONS ABOVE STATED, THE ORGANIZING AUTHORITY EXTENDS ITS INVITATION TO ALL PERSONS HAVING AN INTEREST IN PARTICIPATING IN THE REGATTA, IT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS REGATTA TO PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR FUN IN CONNECTION WITH THE USE OF LIDO 14 SAILBOATS.

The Facilities:

Location: Skinner Lake is located near Temecula approximately 11 miles each of Highway 15 off Rancho California Road.

Camping: Group Campsite "B" has been reserved for this Regatta for Saturday Night June 22, 2002; a covered picnic area is available. Sites at the Lake for other nights and additional sites may be reserved by calling Riverside County Regional Park & Open-Space District at 800 234-7275 or by fax at 909 955-4305. Water, electricity, restrooms and showers are available. A Lake Store is available.

Other Overnight Facilities: If camping isn't your bag . . . There are many other facilities available from Motel Six to Executive Suites. Check the Internet or the yellow pages.

Wineries: There are a number of wineries featuring the finest in locally produced product.

Dinner Saturday Night: Saturday night will be pot luck; all participants are requested to bring dinner items to share. Your sponsors will furnish a hot fire, ice, soft drinks and beer (to those legally entitled).

Swimming: . . . is not allowed. Body contact with the water is to be avoided.

Boat Launching: Requires payment of a nominal fee to the County of Riverside - please pay upon your arrival at the Lake.
