

# LIDOheny Outside Regatta



## NOTICE OF RACE & GENERAL CONDITIONS

- **ORGANIZING AUTHORITY / MANAGEMENT** - The organizing authority for this regatta is the Dana Point Yacht Club. The Dana Point Yacht Club Race Committee will manage this regatta and shall have sole authority to interpret rules and conditions of the race, appoint a protest committee and to accept or reject the entry of any boat.
- **RULES** - The 2001-2004 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of the Lido 14 one-design class, and this Notice of Race, shall govern all races except as any of these are changed by the Sailing Instructions. Saturday/Sunday races, May 22 and 23, are classified as a category A event in accordance with Appendix 1, Regulation 20 – ISAF Advertising Code.
- **ELIGIBILITY** - This regatta is open to Lido 14 boats that are members in good standing of the Lido 14 Class Association.
- **ENTRIES** - Completed entries must be filed with DPYC before 1030 hours, Saturday May 22, 2004. Mail your entry form to: Lido 14 Race Chairman, DPYC, 24399 Dana Drive, Dana Point, CA 92629.
- **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS** – A competitors meeting will be held at DPYC on Saturday, May 22, 2004 at 1000 hours. The first warning for racing both Saturday and Sunday will be at 1200 hours.
- **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** - Sailing Instructions and other important information will be issued Saturday at or before the skipper's meeting. Written questions to the Race Chairperson may be filed before 1000 hours Saturday and Sunday, May 22 and 23, and will be answered and posted 30 minutes after the skipper's meeting or by 1030 hours which ever is later. Sailing Instructions will also be posted on the Dana Point WEB Site (<http://www.dpyc.org>).
- **COURSES / STARTS** – The Sailing Instructions will include a schedule of races and courses. Seven races are scheduled with four races planned on Saturday May 22, 2004 and three races on Sunday May 23, 2004. If one or more races are finished, the regatta will be regarded as complete for trophy purposes. Yachts will race in classes as entered except when the 3-yacht minimum was not achieved. Skippers will be notified by the Race Committee as to the class in which they will compete. A & B classes will start as the Race Committee may determine appropriate in light of sailing conditions and the number of entrants.
- **CHANGES TO RULES** – Rule 44.2 will be changed to make the alternative penalty one 360 turn, not two.
- **SCORING/TROPHIES** - The Low Point scoring system will apply except RRS Appendix A, as modified herein, no throw outs will apply. Take home trophies will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners of each class, each day. A Regatta Trophy will be awarded on Sunday for the overall winners of each class and a special trophy for the boat with most first place finishes.
- **FACILITIES** - All DPYC facilities will be available for use by skippers, crew and guests throughout the weekend, beginning Friday afternoon. A 3,000-lb. hoist will be available for use with the assistance of a qualified DPYC member. Due to the distance from the DPYC clubhouse to the DPYC dry storage yard, competitors are encouraged to place boats in the water before the Competitor's Meeting, if possible. The hoist will be available Saturday from 0830 to 0945 and after the Competitor's meeting. Boats may be left in the water overnight, Saturday, at the DPYC clubhouse docks. Competitors shall provide their own internal lifting sling.
