

NOTICE OF RACE

LIDO 14 CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA

Fern Ridge Lake, Oregon ~ August 8 – 11th, 2004

Hosted by Eugene Yacht Club

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the 'rules', as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2001-2004 (RRS), and the rules of the Lido 14 Class as defined in the current Lido 14 Class Association By-laws except as they are modified by the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 The regatta will be restricted to Category A advertising.

2 ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all current members of the Lido 14 Class Association who have legally raced a Lido 14, as required by By-Law Article XVII.3, sometime between 1958 and June 8th, 2004 (i.e. at least sixty days prior to the Class Championship Regatta).

3 REGISTRATION

- 3.1 Registration may be initiated by sending the completed Registration Form and the entry fee to the Regatta Chairman (see Registration Form for details).
- 3.2 Competitors will be considered registered for the regatta only after: submitting a completed Registration form, submitting a completed Measurement Checklist For The Class Championships, presenting their Official Certificate of Measurement for inspection, weighing of skipper, crew, and handicapping weights (if any), and paying the entry fee.
- 3.3 Registration, weigh-in, and related events will be at the Eugene Yacht Club at the times listed in the schedule.

4 SCHEDULES

- 4.1 Qualifying Races will be held to determine placement in the Gold and Silver flights of the Championship Races. The number of races in the Qualifying Series to be sailed will be published in the Sailing Instructions. Approximately the top half of the Qualifying Race fleet will be assigned to the Gold Flight and the balance to the Silver Flight. The Silver Flight will start each of their races after the corresponding Gold start.

5 BOAT LAUNCHING & STORAGE

- 5.1 Eugene Yacht Club has three launch ramps and two cranes. Competitors shall provide their own internal slings for use with the cranes.
- 5.2 Dry storage and boat washing areas are available on-site.

6 ACCOMMODATIONS

- 6.1 Plentiful camping, RV parking, restrooms and showers, are available on-site.
- 6.2 Richardson Park (a five minute walk from Eugene Yacht Club) offers tent camping, RV sites with hook-ups and allows pets. See www.co.lane.or.us/parks/richard.htm

- 6.4 **No pets are allowed on Eugene Yacht Club grounds at any time**

7 MEASUREMENT

- 7.1 Limited boat and sail measurement will be available, by appointment only, on Sunday August 8. Appointments must be made in advance with Chief Measurer John Gresham who can be reached at (562) 756-7600 or via email at john@gresham.com.
- 7.2 All competing boats must present a fully completed **Official Certificate of Measurement and Registration** and submit a fully completed **Measurement Checklist For The Class Championships** in order to complete registration for the regatta. Contact your fleet measurer or the Chief Measurer for more information on these documents.
- 7.3 All competitors shall present themselves, handicapping weights for themselves, and handicapping weights for their boat for inspection and weigh-in at the times listed in the schedule.

7.4 Per Class rules, competitors are subject to re-measurement.

8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

9 RACING AREA

9.1 The racing area will be Fern Ridge Reservoir.

9.2 A four-stall floating washroom with dock space for four Lidos, affectionately known as “Leakin’ Leana” is anchored near the course.

10 COURSE

10.1 The courses will be windward-leeward and triangles.

11 SCORING

11.1 For the Qualifying Series, the number of races to be sailed, the number to be completed to constitute a series, and the scoring system to be used will be published in the Sailing Instructions.

11.2 The scores of the Qualifying Series will be used, in a manner described in the Sailing Instructions, to assign competitors into the Gold and Silver Flights.

11.3 Each competitor’s ranking into the Gold or Silver Flight shall also be scored as a race in the Championship Series scoring.

11.4 The Championship Series will be scored using the Low Point scoring system of Appendix A of the RRS will apply except that if fewer than six races are completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores.

11.5 For the Championship Series, eight races are scheduled. A minimum of three completed races will constitute a series.

12 PRIZES

12.1 Take home trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the top ten finishing boats in the Gold Flight.

12.2 Take home trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the top five finishing boats in the Silver Flight.

12.3 The W.D. Schock Trophy will be awarded to the Class Champion.

12.4 The Warren F. Pomeroy Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the 1st Gold Flight Race.

12.5 The President’s Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the 2nd Gold Flight Race.

12.6 The Governing Board Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the 3rd Gold Flight Race.

12.7 The Longest Journey Trophy will be awarded to the team that traveled the farthest.

12.8 The Fleet Two Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Silver Flight

12.9 The First Lady Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the 1st woman skipper.

12.10 The Jim Tyler Trophy will be awarded to the 1st family.

12.11 The Grand Master Trophy will be awarded to the 1st skipper 50 years or older.

12.12 The Team Trophy will be awarded to the team with the lowest team score.

13 SAFETY

- 13.1 The organizers of this regatta wish to remind all participants that the US Coast Guard requires that all recreational boats carry one wearable US Coast Guard approved PFD for each person aboard. The State of Oregon further requires sailboats under 16 feet to carry a sound device such as a whistle and that all children 12 years and younger must wear a PFD while the boat is underway.
