About Mission Bay

Mission Bay is part of the recreational Mission Bay Park, which is the largest man-made aquatic park in the country, consisting or 4,235 acres,

approximately 46% land and 54% water. The combined area makes Mission Bay Park the ninth largest municipally owned park in the country. A limit on commercial development of the leaseholds, with no more than 25% of the land area and 6.5% of the water for private purposes, assures that most of the acres that make up Mission Bay are available for public recreational use. The bay has 27 miles of shoreline, 19 of

The bay has 27 miles of shoreline, 19 of which are sandy beaches!

The Weather

Mission Bay Yacht Club

MBYC and Fleet 7 have everything needed to put on a first class Championship Regatta and this isn't their first time to this rodeo. The Lido 14 Class Championships have been held 8 other times at Mission Bay. The first was in 1966 and the last was in 2003 and won by Mark Gaudio and John Papadopoulos. This year will make Mission Bay the most used venue for the Lido Class Championships breaking the tie with Newport Beach which has also hosted the Class Championships 8 times. MBYC has 2 hoists for launching boats from an upland storage area. Be sure to have your boat ready for hoist launching if it is not already. There are showers conveniently available in the

tower building so competitors don't have to miss anything traveling back and forth to their lodging after racing.

Events

This year's Class Championship will continue the great Lido 14 traditions with some great parties and off the water events. It all kicks off after registration on Sunday with a "Welcome Party" at the home of Grant and Barbara Williams. It will be a great time to meet new friends and get reacquainted with old ones. All this while enjoying some fine wines, beers, soda, and snacks while watching a Pacific Ocean sunset. On Monday evening after racing, Fleet 7 will put on a Hawaiian Dinner at MBYC with live Hawaiian Music and dance program. 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Tuesday's dinner will be Mexican food for which the San Diego area is famous so it will be VERY good. Also on Tuesday, following the dinner, will be the Class Annual Meeting. This is your chance as a member to get involved in the nuts and bolts that have kept our class going for over 50 years! What's new this year?

This year at check in, all boats will be weighed to verify weight using the same calibrated scales and equipment. This is regular practice at many big regattas for other classes. This will be done by certified measurers on the measurement committee that will be put together for the regatta. As part of your measurement checklist, you will still want to weigh your boat prior to coming to the regatta to avoid any surprises. Even so, it may be a good idea to bring a

few weights that can be used if needed to get your boat to the minimum 310# after weigh in.

Women's Championship Regatta

On Saturday August 8th, the Saturday just prior to the Class Championship, Fleet 7 will be hosting the Lido 14 Women's Championship Regatta on Mission Bay. The regatta is open to all female persons who have a Lido-14 available for their use in the regatta. Both skipper and crew must be female. Membership in the Lido 14 Class Association is not required. Registration will remain open on Saturday, August 8, from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM. The Competitors' Meeting will take place on Saturday, August 8, at 11:00 AM. The regatta will consist of 3 races. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is



12:30 PM. Prizes will be awarded as soon as possible after the last race. Prizes will be awarded for the first three places. Join the Lido Class Association





History of the Lido 14

Lido 14 history begins with Barney Lehman, boat builder and designer. Barney, best known for his Lehman series of dinghies, had been in development of a 14 foot version of his successful Lehman 10 when he sold his business to W.D. "Bill" Schock. Bill, a successful small boat builder, completed the work that Barney had started by creating a fractional sloop rig, increasing the boat's beam for stability, adding internal seat tanks for comfort and buoyancy, and providing a foredeck and a deck stepped rig rather than the Lehman's traditional keel stepping. The year was 1958 and the location was Newport Beach, California. Newport Beach is one of the sailing centers of the nation, due primarily to the mild weather and the extensive sailing environs of Newport Bay. The bay, naturally created by the void between coastal bluff and a peninsula running along the Pacific Coast, was originally nothing more than sandbars and silt from estuaries. Dredging and development led to a navigable harbor containing eight islands, thirteen yacht clubs and boating associations, thousands of "cottages" large and small, nearly an equal number of boats, and 26 miles of shoreline. It is an ideal location for family sailing and served as the impetus to build a simple, fun, and

comfortable sailing dinghy. It was called the Lido 14. The Lido design was quite revolutionary for its time. It was elegant, stable, easy to use, affordable, and manufactured with modern methods. The response was tremendous. Lido 14 #1 completed in early February of 1958, was taken delivery by Les Littlejohn of Lido Island (Newport Beach, California). By early March 1959, #200 was being built. In the subsequent year, almost 400 Lidos were built. Production continued at a phenomenal rate for quite a few years. Of these, a very large percentage was involved in competitive racing around the nation. It was common for relatively minor regattas to have 60 or more boats and major regattas having limits of 100. As with all one-design boats of the era, the popularity of the Lido 14 peaked in the mid-70's. By 1980, the total number of boats constructed had risen to nearly 5000 but the number of new boats was quickly decreasing. A testament to the quality of the construction is that boats built in 1960 are still actively racing and will continue


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to sail many years to come given a little maintenance and loving care. Perhaps to the chagrin of W.D. Schock Corp., the availability of quality used boats sustains the popularity of the Lido 14, providing an unmatched entry into the wonderful world of small boat sailing. With the remodeled Lido 14 making its introduction in the fall of 1995, interest picked back up.



2007 saw the celebration of the 50 year anniversary of the Lido 14 and Class Association with a wonderful series of parties and reunions at the 2007 Class Championship Regatta in Newport Harbor – quite fitting as it is the birthplace of our beloved Lido 14.

Lido 14 Racing Today

The Lido 14 remains one of the strongest racing classes in the nation. With an average turnout of 45 during the past 5 Class Championship Regattas, the Lido consistently ranks in the top 10 for participation for any class of sailboat! The class is made up of fleets in 10 Districts (6 active) nationwide. Typically California, the birthplace of the Lido, has the highest concentration of members and racing. However, Washington, Oregon, Ohio and even Texas have members and growing

fleets. This year, national membership in the Class is upwards of 270!
